PADEREWSKI PREMIER

1919. After four years of war, Poland was free at last, but ravaged. Over a century of fragmentation among Russia, Germany and Austria made reconstruction all the more complicated.

As far as the victors were concerned, the international piano star and great patriot Ignacy Paderewski (1860-1941), resident in Morges, on the edge of the lake Lemán since 1897, was the only personality capable of forming a national union government. On January 17, 1919, the illustrious figure became the first recognised president of the Council of Ministers of the Second Polish Republic. He was however forced to resign already on December 9, having completed an enormous amount of work, but having also faced insurmountable obstacles on the Polish political and military scene.

Using documents often previously unpublished, this exhibition invites you to relive the highlights of this outstanding presidential year, and also to embrace Ignacy Paderewski's patriotic commitment as a whole, from the Krakow and Lwów founding speeches in 1910 to the ultimate fight of the Polish government in exile in 1939-1941, including the Vevey Committee (1914), the League of Nations (1920) and the Morges Front (1936).

POLAND THROUGH THE CENTURIES

1000 years of history in 50 dates and 9 maps with Paderewski's patriotic commitment in parallel.

1910 – GRUNWALD

Inauguration of the Grunwald monument in Krakow & Chopin speech in Lwów: first official steps of his patriotic commitment.

1914 – VEVEY

Creation of the Vevey Committee with Henryk Sienkiewicz: Paderewski at war for Poland.

1915-1918 – AMERICA

Polish Victims' Relief Fund, Helena Paderewska's dolls, ambassador to the National Polish Committee for President Wilson, formation of a corps of volunteers and creation of the Polish White Cross: commitment of the Paderewski couple overseas prior to their return to Europe.

1919 – POLAND

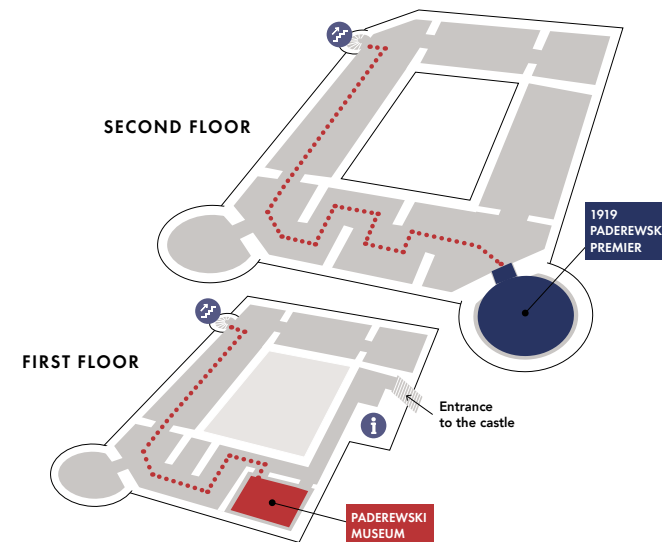
Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs of the first government of the Second Polish Republic and head of the Polish delegation to the Paris Peace Conference; from glory to decline, the painful experience of power.

1920-1941 – GENEVA - PARIS - MORGES - NEW YORK

Official Polish delegate to the first League of Nations Assembly in Geneva, founder of the Morges Front in 1936 and of the "Pro Polonia" Committee in 1939, first President of the National Council of the Polish Republic in exile in 1940 and founder of the *Paderewski Testimonial Fund* in New York: the fight went on right up to the final American salute and national funeral at the Arlington cemetery.

HELENA & IGNACY

Behind glass, a few personal objects of his and hers – and in drawers, documents connected with the Paderewski couple's patriotic commitment (programmes, letters, photos, prints...).
